Samuel Owen Jeter, 83, formerly of Greenwood, husband of Martha Sue Dillard Jeter, died Saturday, March 2, 2019 at Hospice and Palliative Care of the Piedmont.

Born in Nashville, TN, he was the son of the late Thomas and Mildred Jones Jeter. Samuel was a retired U. S. Navy veteran having served during the Korean War and Vietnam.
